LAMAR TOWN CODE

Article II. WATER AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM

17.201.1. ENABLING ACT

The town shall furnish water to persons for reasonable compensation and charge a reasonable charge for maintenance of a sewerage system. Such charges shall be fixed from time to time by the Town Council.

17.204.1 FAILURE TO PAY FEES OR CHARGES

The town hereby reserves the right to discontinue service to any premises for failure to pay water and sewer charges when due and payable as set out in this Article.

17.204.2 WATER AND SEWER BILLINGS

- a. Each monthly water bill shall become due and payable in its entirety on the 20th day of each month. Each bill shall include a monthly sewer service charge, as hereinafter provided, which shall be added to the water bill and collected as a part thereof.
- b. A garbage fee, as provided in Section 10.3.. hereof, shall be added to the water bill for all water users within the corporate limits.
